Improvements at the Village Hall

Thanks to the growing use of and fund raising at the Hall including securing grants, we are carrying out some improvements to the Hall and its facilities and equipment. These include:

- *Purchasing a 75" Smart TV for the Main Hall. The existing 49" TV has been relocated to the Lewis Room, making the Lewis Room an ideal venue for presentations or other meetings.
- *Purchasing a new CCTV system covering all the outside areas and the installation of a monitor in the kitchen. We can access the CCTV system video feed remotely.
- Purchasing 12 folding tables and two storage trolleys.
- Replacing the broken concrete bollards in the car with two concrete filled steel bollards. These have Hi-Viz. paint which we hope will make them more visible.
- Making Village Hall car spaces more visible including new signage which will make it clear which spaces are reserved for Village Hall users and which are spaces for the public. By way of a reminder, all the spaces up to those level with where the side patio and children's play area meet, are for village hall users.

*The purchase of the CCTV and TV was part funded by the UK Government through the Rural England Prosperity Fund in partnership with Wychavon District Council.







Stoulton Parish Council Update

Playground

The Clerk explained that she has been liaising with Sovereign the playground equipment supplier and Wychavon regarding the Roral Fund grant agreement and payment dates. The Grant has now been paid in full and the playground works are completed, we await the security fencing to be removed so that the equipment installation can be checked.

Village Hall Committee

This year we held our Christmas dinner as a Sunday lunch event in January which proved successful and was well attended.

The December Coffee morning raised £500 for Alzheimer Research in addition to money raised through the stall that the charity had set up for the event.

Regular bookings have recommended in the New Year starting with the January coffee morning which was well attended despite being so close to the New Year (January 4th) and the very cold weather.

There is no Thursday lunch in January.

A problem with the floor was identified in the latter part of 2024 and this has been inspected and patched. However, it would appear that the problem is due to dry rot in the floor supports. This is likely to require major work to replace the beams and floor and the committee is considering the best approach.

We will need to explore grant opportunities. It is several years since we have requested grants for the VH and so we hope that requests will be viewed favourably.

We also had an issues with the locking mechanism on the front door during a family party which could not be unlocked either on the inside or outside. Thanks to Giles for his efforts in acquiring the services of a locksmith on a Sunday who was able to remove, clean and lubricate the mechanism without us having to replace.

As ever many thanks to the committee members and other volunteers whose hard work makes the Village Hall the success that it is.

County Councillor Updates

The engineers at Wychavon need to capture details of any internally flooded properties in Wychavon. This has been requested by WCC its role as lead Local Flood authority (contact Martyn Cross at WDC)

I have attached a statement I have prepared re proposals towards Unitary proposals and hope it offers some clarification but would stress that nothing is definite at the moment. I think we can safely say though that change is coming!

Pershore Education Planning Area review- forthcoming changes.

Decisions have been reached to extend the age ranges of all the first schools in the Pershore Education Planning Area to become primary schools. The middle schools in Pershore will no longer have a point of entry into Year 5 for September 2025, and Pershore High School's intake will be expanded to accommodate all Year 7 pupils in the area from September 2027.

Devolution

1. Prior to Christmas the government announced major changes to how local government will operate in the years to come, following the publication of its White Paper.

Nothing has been decided but the government's intent seems to be clear, and I would suggest these changes will happen.

I will try to outline the proposed changes and how these changes are likely to affect Worcestershire.

- The government wants to abolish District Councils and County Councils and replace them with one Unitary Council. This would mean that the six District Councils and the County Council in Worcestershire would all disappear to be replaced with one Unitary Council. Town Councils and Parish Councils will not be affected.
- The timeline for this is very short. The government want "letters of interest" by interested parties by 10th January 2025. It is my understanding that the government will make its decision early in March as to which counties will proceed in "the first tranche". If Worcestershire was in "the first tranche", it is likely that elections in May 2025 to the County Council will be cancelled and elections to the new Unitary Council may be held in May 2026.
- The above is further complicated because this is the first phase of the government's proposed changes. Once the counties have become Unitary Councils, the government

then wishes to create Strategic Authorities. It is proposed that each Unitary Council will represent approximately 500,000 people; Worcestershire has 600,000. Strategic Authorities will be made up of a number of Unitary Councils (2 or 3), headed by an elected Mayor.

- A letter of interest has now been submitted to the Government by the leading political group at County. It was felt that if Worcestershire was to have any say in shaping its own future it is imperative that we are in the first tranche. It remains to be seen if Worcestershire itself will remain united as a single unitary authority or is linked with other shires.
- The Cabinet met to discuss the government's proposals and we decided it was clear that these were not really proposals, they were changes which the government intends to implement. With the "majority" which the government has, then of course, any legislation would pass through Parliament with ease.
- We decided that if Worcestershire was to have any say in shaping its future, it is imperative that Worcestershire is in "the first tranche".

SWDP Update

The Joint Parishes Committee responded with feedback to the November Liaison meeting (separate document).

The South Worcestershire Councils have now provided their updated evidence documents to the Planning Inspectors in response to their Matters, Issues and Questions raised in early 2024.

Ian Kemp, Programme Officer for the South Worcestershire Development Plan Review, has written out to stakeholders providing an outline timetable for the Hearing Sessions that will commence from Tuesday 4th March at Worcester Guildhall.

Hearings relating to Worcestershire Parkway are likely to be held at Wychavon offices in Pershore according to the draft timetable. We have an opportunity to participate in hearing sessions and provide further comments to the Inspectors in relation to the updated documents.

The JPC are meeting on 21st January to discuss our approach with the intention of participating in Hearing Sessions and providing further comments to the Inspectors in relation to the revised documents.

An <u>Examination Website</u> has been established and will be regularly updated throughout the process.

This also contains a link to all of the documents submitted.
